1. In his first two chapters Amos writes, "For three transgressions of ___ and for four I will not revoke its punishment." What are the transgressions of Judah and Israel in 2:4-8, 12?

Have you ever caught yourself tolerating sin, thinking God won't discipline you because you're his child? Explain.

2. What point is Amos trying to make in 3:2-8? Do you have an example of a similar result in your life?

3. What phrase is repeated five times in Amos 4:6-11? What point is God making? (Also see v. 12)

Has God made you aware of a sin that you have not yet turned from?

4. What is God urging the people to do in 5:4-6?

What especially grieves God in Amos 5:21-24 and 6:1-6? Have you seen either of these in your life?

5. In Amos 7:1-9:10 God gives Amos five visions. Amos successfully pleads mercy from God for the first two in 7:1-6. Why doesn't he plead for Israel in the next three visions? (7:8-9; 8:1-3; 9:1)

What is this telling us about God's judgment?

How does this emphasize the value of Christ in your life?

6. Read Amos 9:11-15. What does this tell us about God?

How does this give you hope for the future?
