# Newsletter—July 2024

### Clarity

James L. Synder put together a series of messages by A.W. Tozer in his book *Lead Like Christ*. It was interesting to "hear" Tozer say that he was more vulnerable to sin when he wasn't doing what God called him to do. If he's correct, it's important that we all know and do what God has called us to do! Does God really have a calling for each of us? Speaking of Christ the Apostle Paul writes, "who gave Him-



self for us to redeem us from every lawless deed, and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds." (Titus 2:14, *NASB*). Ephesians 2:10 says, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." Good works and good deeds are God's general calling for all Christ-followers. The Lord has even given each of us at least one spiritual gift to use, "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit. <sup>5</sup> And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord. <sup>6</sup> There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons. <sup>7</sup> But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (1 Corinthians 12:4–7).

Unfortunately, too many Christians don't know what their gifting is, and where or how to use it (i.e. their calling). Equally unfortunate is the lack of understanding that serving in our gifting is largely something to be done in community. Churches form mission and vision statements to help, but often people struggle to connect themselves to those statements, and to others in the church, and to know how to apply them. We are one of those churches. We have formed mission and vision statements, more than once. The current vision is to build families by joining people to Christ to transform communities. We haven't done well in communicating, implementing, or in helping people find their part in this vision. This is an area in which our leadership lacks understanding and experience.

A fair and legitimate question is, "Why is this important?" Jesus said, "If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. <sup>25</sup> If a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand." (Mark 3:24–25). We might think, "We aren't working against each other!" We may not be intentionally working against each other, but it's no secret that there are multiple different priority preferences among the people of every church. If a team of horses are not pulling in the same direction what will the result be? Even if the leadership somehow manages to hold the "team" together, where will it end up other than being very exhausted?

The power of a shared vision is that it unifies many to "pull" in the same direction. Such uniting harnesses the strength of each into a powerful whole. In John 17:22–23 Jesus said, "The glory which You have given Me I have given to them, that they may be one, just as We are one; <sup>23</sup> I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity, so that the world may know that You sent Me, and loved them, even as You have loved Me." The church that is united in its vision gives powerful testimony to the gospel of Christ in its community.

The importance of our mission, and having a shared vision, and our unsuccessful track record, helped the Elders make the decision last month to utilize the services of Clarity House. Clarity House is a Christian consulting firm that specializes in helping churches clarify, develop, and implement their unique vision to make disciples. Our five-person team, which includes Pastor Dan and Pastor Kevin, is being formed right now. They will do some preliminary preparation then begin the eight-month process which includes two face-to-face meetings and eight online zoom meetings with a few other churches which will begin in September.

There's an old adage that says, aim for nothing and you'll hit it every time. Whether it's bowling, archery, baseball, tennis, or horseshoes, if the target is not in focus a miss is a sure thing. We want to see clearly and aim together, that we might experience God's grand purpose for us as individuals and a church body. Please pray for MBC, this team, and this process in the next several months.

# Child Protection Training

It's Summer—Your Child Protection Certification has Expired!

If you plan to work with youth in any capacity at MBC, you need to complete Annual Child Protection Training. Summer months are the best time to do this! Training consists of online video certification for everyone 11 years old and up, and background checks on all adults every two years. Contact the church office today, don't wait!

I recently listened to a program on "In the Market" with Janet Parshall. It was titled "The Role of the Holy Spirit in Prayer Life". The speaker was Dr. Bill Thrasher who is head of the Master's Program at Moody called Spiritual Discipleship and Spiritual Formation. He had written "A Journey to Victorious Praying" and "How to Resurrect a Dead Prayer Life". These books would be worth reading.



The following are some of his insights about prayer: Many people don't understand prayer. Prayer is God's idea. He wants us to communicate with Him. Is God putting a prayer burden on your heart? The Holy Spirit plays a vital part in any believer's prayer life. Walk in the Spirit, don't quench the Spirit, don't come to God with your own expectations. Come seeking what God wants to do in regards to your prayer request. Remember prayer involves spiritual warfare. Satan doesn't want you to pray. "Ye have not, because you ask not." Submit to God—James 4:7. It gives you freedom and confidence. Spend much time in God's Word, not just five minutes a day. Spend much time in prayer, too. Let God set the agenda for your prayer life. God will help you know what to pray. D.L. Moody said "I would rather teach a person to pray, than teach ten people how to preach."

You can listen to this program in the "In the Market" archives. The date of the program was June 5th. I highly recommend that you listen to it.

- ◆ Families with the last name beginning N Z should also bring a salad



A young family that is supported by MBC will be here to meet you and tell about their call to serve the Lord in a place that is hostile to the Gospel. For their well-being we won't disclose their name or country in this article, but you will be blessed to learn about their obedience and trust in our mighty God while living in a country that persecutes Christians. They left a secure profession, home, friends, family, and American lifestyle to live in a foreign culture so an unreached people might know Jesus. MBC started supporting this family, who lived not very far from Monroe, shortly before they left the U.S. for the mission field. This is your first opportunity to hear about their ministry as they present the message Sunday morning. Be aware the sermon will NOT be recorded or on YouTube for their safety, so you must come to church. There will be a potluck after second service so that we can get to know them personally. They are thankful for the support MBC gives them and are eager to get acquainted. Let's show them, through our hospitality, how much we appreciate them!

Occasionally the missions ministry is asked how one can suggest a mission or missionary for support by MBC. If you know of someone seeking support, let one of people on the Missions Ministry know. They will be added to our list and when one of the missionaries we currently support leaves the field, we prayerfully consider who we might add. We try to keep a balance between overseas and in country missions as we are aware of the need for evangelism here at home as well as abroad. We consider whose statement of faith fits best with MBC and is Bible based. It is also important that we take good care of those currently supported. When special needs arise, we need to be able to help. Of course we would love to support everyone, but it is not possible financially. We are very thankful for those of you who are able to individually support mission work financially. Remember to pray for missionaries even if you are unable to help financially. And let us all remember to be emissaries for Jesus every day wherever we are.





