The	Setting

I. The Apostle (1-3)

Paul recognized his *position* and *purpose* in relation to God's *promise*.

II. The Apprentice (4)

Paul appreciated his relationship with Titus.

Fulfilling our purpose in life begins with a correct <u>identity</u> and grows through godly <u>relationships</u>.

<u>Application Questions</u> - These questions are provided for your further study and application of the subject of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out answers to these questions will help drive home the point. They are designed to be discussed in your home, with other believers, and in a Life Group for even more benefit.

1. Read Titus 1:1-3. Paul identifies himself as a servant or bondservant, and an apostle. How would you describe each of those roles?

Do either, or both, of these descriptions describe the role(s) God has given you? What does, or would, it look like in your everyday life?

2. What did Paul see as his purpose, or goal, in these roles? (verse 1)

If you see, or were to see, yourself with the same goal, what does it look like in week to week living?

3. Paul called eternal life "the hope" (verse 2) that God promised. What other Bible verse can you think of that reveals knowing Christ as Savior gives hope?

How would you use that verse to help someone see that salvation is the greatest hope we can have?

4. Paul calls Titus his "true child in a common faith" in Titus 1:4. What would that description reveal about their relationship?

Are you investing in someone like Paul did with Titus? What does, or would, it look like?

Is someone investing in you, like Paul did with Titus? What does, or would, it look like?

5. Write a sentence summarizing your identity and purpose in Christ.

What are the best ways God helps you experience fulfilling His purpose?
