

Thy Will Be Done

I've been looking for themes God may be trying to show me about what He wants to work on in me. I thought a quick review of the verses in my journal over the last several days would surface not only a theme, but something to write about. This morning these words caught my attention, "Calling His



disciples to Him, He said to them, "Truly I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the contributors to the treasury; ⁴⁴ for they all put in out of their surplus, but she, out of her poverty, put in all she owned, all she had to live on." (Mark 12:43–44, *NASB95*).

This is one of those truths we don't like as Americans living in a prosperous place where our basic needs are relatively easy to meet. Pointing to that widow, Jesus told His disciples *God measures by sacrifice not size*. Our struggle isn't in giving out of our surplus, but in what we want to hold back (See Ananias & Sapphira, Acts 5).

This is very much in line with what Mark has been recording from the life and teachings of Jesus. For example, Jesus answered the question of the scribe concerning the most important commandment in this way, "Jesus answered, "The foremost is, 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is one Lord; ³⁰ and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' ³¹ "The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:29–31). To love God and others like that requires some significant sacrifice!

Jesus warned His disciples about the "leaven" of Herod (materialism) and of the Pharisees (hypocrisy) in Mark 8:15-17. Then He clarified what it means to be a follower of His, "And He summoned the crowd with His disciples, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. ³⁵ "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it." (Mark 8:34–35 (NASB95). Jesus laid it out, if you wish to follow Me, you have to sacrifice your desires for Mine. Jesus taught sacrifice in terms of humility (receiving children, Mark 9:37), wealth, (how hard it is for the wealthy to enter the kingdom of God, Mark 10:23-25), and priorities ("Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." (Mark 12:17).

What was the widow thinking, and what was her motive for sacrificing, "all she had to live on"? Was it her love for God, her desire to express her worship of Him, how much He meant to her, or her trust in Him? Perhaps it was all of these, we can only speculate. What would Jesus want us to sacrifice? I'm sure more than money. The bigger issue is more a question of why, than what, we would sacrifice. All of this can be overwhelming.

However, it should point us to the gospel of Christ. Jesus broke the power of desires for the things that separate us from fellowship with God on the cross. There He set us free to love God more than all other things. It isn't mustering up enough self-discipline on our own but turning to Christ in faith that we find our way. It's keeping our faith focused on Christ and what He accomplished for us. Consider the desperate father, "And Jesus said to him, 'If You can?' All things are possible to him who believes.'" (Mark 9:23). And Jesus' words to His disciples, "Therefore I say to you, all things for which you pray and ask, believe that you have received them, and they will be granted you. (Mark 11:24). Of course, the qualifier is God's will, which takes us to where the sacrifice battle rages – His will or mine.

The missions ministry has a couple exciting things to mention this month. Many of you have asked about Viktor and Lena Schpits, our Slavic Gospel Association (SGA) missionaries in Kazakhstan, who were desperately in need of a different vehicle in order to continue effectively ministering to the villages around them. MBC sent a generous donation to them through SGA and we received a very grateful thank you from them in January along with a video of the family joyously picking up their new car. The short video will be shown during services on February 16th. An excerpt from their email reads, "We sincerely thank you for your help, for your intercession in collecting material resources, for all the donations of the brothers and sisters. May the Lord reward you many more times...This car is a great miracle for our church...Everyone is happy and thanks be to Christ!!! Glory to Him forever and ever....We wish you joy in service, peace in your heart, love in your family. God's guidance and blessings to the fullest, in readiness for the Coming of the Lord." Thank you MBC for responding so generously to this need!

The second announcement regards the 2025 short-term mission trip which is planned for June 8th -14th in the Dominican Republic. We are partnering with Kids Around The World this year which is a new mission experience. You may recall this is the same mission organization through which we funded a playground and hold One Meal Food Packing events. If you are feeling a calling to this year's trip, please plan now to attend one of the informational meetings. This is a requirement even if you have gone on previous mission trips. Things will be done a little differently this year, and we want you to have all the information you need. Dates and times for these meetings can be found on the church calendar and in the bulletin.

Lastly, the missions ministry is pleased to announce two new members. Tonya Reed and Annette Stormont join Bernadette Wong, Rich Peach, Bernie Roidt, and myself (Crystal Zimmerman). We are pleased to have fresh input and ideas as we strive to be the hands and feet of Jesus.





Clarity House Update:

In May of last year, the Elders decided to use the services of Clarity House to guide us through an 8-month process of discernment about how we, as a church, can move forward as the disciple-making body we are called to be. This process is specifically around the areas of mission, vision and implementation. The team consists of Pastor Dan, Pastor Kevin, Loren Bruehlman, Amy Haworth, and Amanda Ohlrich. We are now halfway through the process, and here are some of the big discussions and take-aways:

As a church we need to rethink our disciple-making model. For a long time, the goal of many American churches has been Attend-Connect-Serve. Get people to attend, connect them to a small group, and get them to serve in ministry. This has been relatively successful in making churchgoers, but not disciples. To make disciples, we need to make a change. Our first step in this was to shift our thinking away from leaders being the ministry heroes, to leaders empowering the whole church to be in ministry.

Next, we looked at our church and community specifically to understand who and where we are unique and how God might be using us to make disciples. From this we formed the following statement:

We exist to glorify God and make disciples by empowering a family-focused, Bible-anchored and authentically-caring congregation in a spiritually hard, performance-driven and ideologically divided community with a deep passion for reaching the lost, transforming lives and protecting the flock.

With this we have been attempting to create a mission statement that is meaningful, memorable and mobilizing. This has proven more difficult than expected because they are pushing us away from "Christianese" language and really challenging us to be specific. Our current draft is:

Sharing the hope of Christ in everything we do.

Building on this, we are currently working on articulating our Dream Disciple, a tool that helps us clarify four roles that we want to help people grow into, so they can embody the mission of our church in their everyday places of life. This also gives us our mission measures and helps us know if we are successful in making disciples. Our current draft is as follows:

Devoted Follower

Role: I desire to be, and therefore consistently am, with Jesus in prayer, Bible reading, and worship.

Question 1: How would you describe your walk with Christ today?

Question 2: What has God shown you about Himself recently?

Intentional Neighbor

Role: I go out of my way to meet the needs of others.

Question 1: How have you served others within and outside your church recently?

Question 2: Who don't you want to be a neighbor to right now?

Joyful Servant

Role: I delight in doing what God tells me to do through His Word and Spirit.

Question 1: What area of your life are you finding hardest to surrender control to God?

Question 2: How would you describe your current attitude toward obeying God?

Humble Multiplier

Role: Seeing others as more important than myself, I seize opportunities to reproduce in them what God has done and is doing in me.

Question 1: How have you built up a fellow believer this week?

Question 2: Who are you currently building a relationship with in order to share the Gospel?
