2. Read Titus 2:12. What 2 lifestyles does God's grace in salvation "instruct" us to deny? How would you define each?

What 3 ways does this grace instruct us to live? How would you define these in a short phrase?

If, or when, you are not living like this, what might be the reason?

3. Titus 2:13 gives another lifestyle God's grace in salvation should draw out. What is it?

Is this part of your lifestyle? How often? What does it look like?

4. Titus 2:14 tells us the purpose of Jesus' sacrifice was more than to provide the way to heaven for us. It was to make us His \_\_\_\_\_\_.

In that, what change in our relation to deeds/works did Jesus provide?

What outcome is His desire, and what motivation would there be?

- 5. Read Titus 2:15. Paul gives Titus instructions with some strong words! If you were in Titus's shoes, how would you exercise your authority, keeping in mind God's grace?
- 6. Write out a short prayer in response to what you've learned in this passage.
